

A GOOD CASE OF HEARTBURN

Luke 24:32

A subject that too many of us are acquainted with. If you have no “inside” information on the subject right now, just wait a while Time and age seem to have a way of introducing it to you. If you have or do experience it, you know it causes you to seek relief quickly.

TEXT

The two disciples on their way to Emmaus were probably Mr. and Mrs. Cleopas. They together invited the Lord to stay in their home. In verse 32, the word ‘heart’ is a singular noun with a plural possessive pronoun. They were in agreement in the invitation. The meal was, as custom required, an act of hospitality (entertaining strangers) but became a supper of remembrance as they recognized who the Stranger was.

It was not the meal that caused the “heart burn’ but the flame of love and devotion. So many today need a burning heart, one set aflame by -

A. The Fire Of Meditation:

- A. Psalm 39:1-3 - good to meditate before speaking
- B. Gen. 24:63 - to think ahead or about - in expectation
- C. Josh 1:8 - right kind leads to prosperity and success
- D. Psalm 1:1-4 - establishes and strengthens
- E. The Psalmist found it to be a real comfort and encouragement

B. The fire of adoration - praise Psalm 45: 1-6; Psalm 45: 17

- A. Psalm 33:1,2 - praise is comely (becoming)
- B. Psalm 50: - whoso offered praise glorifieth me...
- C. Psalm 119; 164 - seven times a day I praise thee...

C. The Fire Of Proclamation Jeremiah 20:9

- A. Matthew 4:19,20 - Jesus began to preach
- B. Mark 2:2 - He preached the Word to them
- C. Matthew 11:1 - He preached in their cities
- D. Mark 16:20 - the disciples went forth and preached everywhere
- E. 1 Corinthians 1:21 -
- F. Acts 20:24-27 - Paul - I have not shunned to declare
